Arrupe Academy of Vocational Education (AAVE) is instituted to organize skill development courses for the students. This in-campus opportunity is much appreciated by the staff and students. AAVE offers Certificate courses like Photography, Photoshop, Spoken english, Yoga, music (key board), Music (drums), Classical dance, Driving (2 & 4 wheeler), computer and Lap top hardware services and net working, Maths for competitive examinations and numerical ability, Arts and craft and Web designing to the students.

REPORT ON ALL ACTIVITIES (2012-2018)

ACADEMIC YEAR 2017-2018

AAVE organized three courses for skill development of students in the even semester. The duration is two months from March to April.

(i) Four wheeler driving, (ii) Spoken English, (iii) Music class for Key Board were conducted. More than 30 students participated in the Four – wheeler driving classes. Though eight courses were provided, for the want of sufficient number, only three courses were conducted. The service of AAVE is much appreciated by students that it caters to their extra skill development in an advantagous cost and convenient time span within the campus.

ACADEMIC YEAR 2016-2017

The College has launched AAVE- 2017 program in the even semester in the month of March for the benefit of students. This 30 Hrs program caters to students for the development of their extra-curricular and skill based training. Total of 120 students is benefitting from this program.

There are eight courses provided by AAVE as follows

1. PHOTOGRAPHY, 2. PHOTOSHOP, 3. SPOKEN ENGLISH, 4. YOGA, 5. MUSIC (Key Board), 6. MUSIC (Drums), 7. CLASSICAL DANCE, 8. DRIVING (2 & 4 Wheeler).

ACADEMIC YEAR 2015-2016

In collaboration with the Department of Economics a Five day training programme on Soft Skills was organized for the final year students from 22-02-2016 to 26-02-2016. The students were given orientation on motivation, self-confidence, effective communication, creativity & innovation, and numerical ability. The resource persons were Mr. S Vairavarajan, Director, Entrepreneurial Guidance Cell, Palayamkottai, Dr. S. Manova Raja, CEO, Fragrhen Academy, Chennai, Mr. E. Robert Kennedy, Zonal Trainer, Thanjavur, and Mr. S. Rathakrishnan, Director, Triangle Training Centre, Tirunelveli.

ACADEMIC YEAR 2014-2015

For the academic year 2014 2015, the AAVE has conducted six certificate courses. The courses that were conducted are computer and Lap top hardware services and net working, Photoshop, Instrumental Music, Maths for competitive examinations and numerical ability, Arts and craft and Web designing. The courses were provided for both shift I and shift II students. A total number of one hundred and twenty five students actively participated and were benefitted.

ACADEMIC YEAR 2013-2014

AAVE (Arrupe Academy of Vocational Education)

In the Odd Semester, Certificate Courses on Photoshop and Web Designing were offered by the Department of Visual Communication. A Course on Mathematics for Competitive Examination was conducted by the Department of Mathematics and Samayal Kalai was offered by the Department of Botany. Fifty students successfully completed the courses and obtained their certificates. A Certificate Course on Communicative English was organized by the Department of Computer Applications for the MCA students in order to improve their communication skills.

In the Even Semester, the Department of Visual Communication offered a certificate course on Paining and thirty students learned the art of paining. Rev.Dr.Xavier Antony S.J. Mr.Chidambaranathan, Dr.G.Sahaya Anthony Xavier, Mr.Prabahaar, Mr.Sahaya Babu taught these courses.

Under the STAR (Standard Training Assessment & Reward) Scheme of the National Skill Development Corporation, Government of India, two certificate courses-"Retail Sale

Associates" and "Mobile Repair Technician"- were offered by the Providres Skill Academy, Chennai through AAVE. 220 students participated in these courses and obtained certificates successfully. Dr.A.John De Britto, Coordinator of AAVE, effectively monitored these programmes in this academic year.
