Arnold's criterion of great Poetry

1. Gives joy when the situation is painful

" A lovely bird, with azure wings,

And song that said a thousand things

And seem'd to say them all for me!" (The Prisoner of Chillon)

- 1. Treats action rather than thought
- 2. Pleases as a whole and not merely in parts
- 3. Its highest models are the ancient classics



How does Homer achieve it?


> His rapidity of movement

- > Simple lucidity of mind




- >The Grand Style therefore, 'arises in poetry when a noble nature poetically gifted, treats with simplicity or severity a serious subject.'
